Hand in hand with homelessness looms inadequate education. Because of lack of income, inadequate funding for schools, and other socio-economic factors, many today are denied quality schooling. This often leads to poverty and then, to despair. Lack of education may be America's number one social issue. We intend to offer solutions that have an impact.

Ten (10) scholarships of \$1000 each are available to students in Mississippi, Texas, and Wisconsin. The award is renewable through the first year of undergraduate studies. \$500 will be paid directly to your school's financial aid office for your first semester. To maintain The Donald Driver Scholarship for your second semester you agree to:

- 1 Maintain a 3.0 cumulative GPA. If a 3.0 is not met, please continue to send the Foundation your grades at the end of each semester. Your scholarship may be reinstated if your grades improve.
- 2 Remain a full-time student (12 credit hours). The DDF will only award funding if you maintain full-time status.
- 3 Mail a transcript or grade report to The Donald Driver Foundation that includes both semester and cumulative GPAs.
- 4 Perform and participate in one service project that benefits homelessness, education, or low-income populations. Your service project must be approved by the Foundation.

Application Deadline: May 30, 2019

Scholarship recipients notified: July 1, 2019 via mail

Eligibility Guidelines:

GPA of 3.0 or higher, based on a 4.0 scale

ACT Score of 18 or higher

SAT Score of 1000 or higher

Open to Mississippi, Texas, and Wisconsin residents

only must be a college-bound high school senior.

Accepted and/or attending an accredited 2- or 4-year college, university, or technical school. Maintain full-time status (12 credits)

Must complete a minimum of 20 hours of community service

Instructions:

- 1 Complete and sign the application.
- 2 Submit a copy of an official high school transcript. If available, make sure that your ACT score is listed on the transcript.
- 3 We want to know what others have to say about you! Applicants are required to submit two letters or recommendation from teachers/professors, religious leaders, coaches, employers or others who have an important role in your life. **One letter must be from someone affiliated with a school.**
- 4 Essay Format: Use 8 1/2" by 11" white paper; typed. Double space your essay and use a 1-inch margin on all sides. Be sure to include your full name and social security number in the upper right corner on each page.
- 5 Include a brief financial need statement at the end of your essay. Tell us about any family circumstance that may affect your family's ability to pay for college.
